✱ I would recommend a stone bar that could weather rain and sunshine without erosion. In the inner cavity of the bar, facing the bartender or host, you could design shelves, a tiny bar sink on one side of the counter, and a recess with electrical sockets for a mini fridge. Allow your wine cooler to be placed inside the house, and only give the provision of a miniature wine rack on one side of the bar counter.

✱ Go with water-resistant water hyacinth furniture for the terrace or treated cast iron furniture if you are located near the sea like Mumbai or have to contend with the rains. Wicker, while more charming will not last a monsoon. ►

transition from one room to the other should be smooth. Using similar materials becomes essential, especially in small spaces. It’s important that there shouldn’t be too many materials used, which will cause chaos,” they suggest.

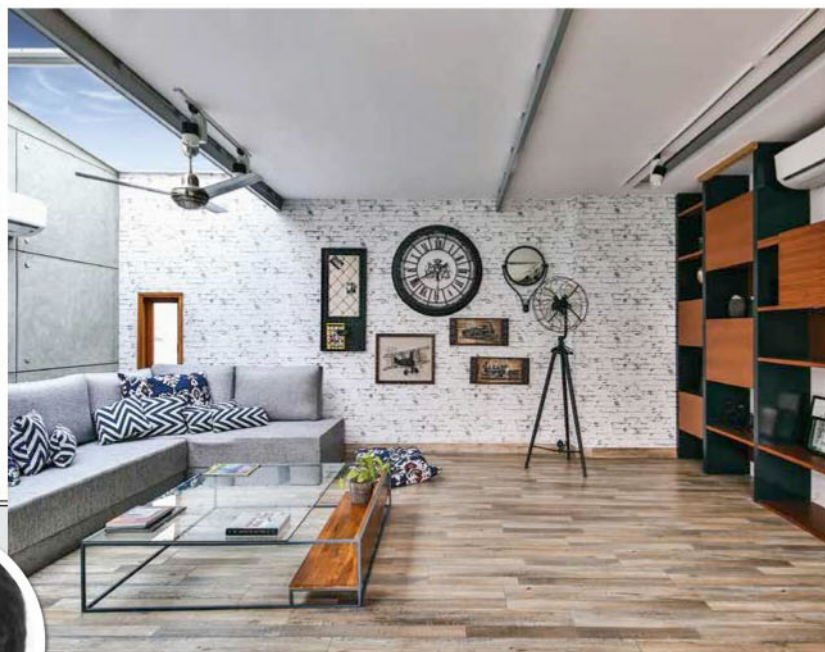
"I think colour is something that is on every designer's radar. Colour has the ability to transform a space like nothing else can. You can use it to enhance movement or create separate spaces with incredible ease. Homes are now more than spaces to simply relax; they have become places to entertain, to eat, drink and work. The use of consistent colours and textures to tie up various areas within a space helps give you fluidity. For example, there's no need to have an accent colour or wallpaper applied to only one wall. It's better to wrap the same colour across at least three walls to give it a more

unified look. Fluidity is almost abstract, it's more a feeling than a product. To create this sense of space and freedom, decor needs to be used intelligently. Colour plays a huge role when it comes to encouraging movement, neutral shades always connect spaces while more vibrant hues tend to break them apart. When trying to create a fluid space, look at pastel shades and neutral colours for a sense of harmony. One colour as the base of your walls, running up on window and door frames as sort of an emphasis skirting, will tie the entire space together. Avoid stark contrasts as these will separate zones rather than maintain one, large, fluid area." ►

POTATO LEAF SOUP

INGREDIENTS

- Leeks 3 large
- Butter 2tbsp
- Vegetable stock 4 cups
- Himachali potatoes 300gms
- Himalayan salt, to taste
- Dried marjoram, a pinch
- Fresh thyme, 1-2 sprigs or Dried thyme 1/2tsp
- Bay leaf 1
- Sweet potato leaves 1/4 cup
- Black pepper to taste
- Garlic 3 cloves
- Pumpkin seed oil

METHOD

1 Clean and cut the leeks: Cut the leeks lengthwise and fan them open under running water to dislodge any dirt or mud inside. No need to discard the trimmings - they can all be used to make stock. Finely chop the cleaned leeks and keep ready.

2 Cook leeks in butter to soften: Melt butter on medium heat in a thick-bottomed pot. Add the chopped leeks and stir to coat with the butter. Cover the pot and lower the heat; cook till they soften, then add the herbs and bay leaf. The leeks should not brown.

3 Add broth, potatoes, herbs, salt, bring to simmer and cook: Add the stock, diced potatoes and a teaspoon of salt to the pot. Increase the heat to high to bring to a simmer, then lower the heat to maintain a low simmer, and cook for 20 minutes, until the potatoes are cooked through. Add the sweet potato leaves and cook for two more minutes.

4 Purée the soup: Remove and discard the bay leaf and thyme sprig. Use a standing blender to blend the entire soup to a purée and then pass through a fine sieve. Finish with pumpkin seed oil. ▶

KALE SALAD

INGREDIENTS

- **Cherry tomato** 1/4 cup
- **Pea shoots** 50gms
- **Fresh kale** 400gms
- **Kachampoli vinegar** 50ml
- **Olive oil** 50ml
- **Seasoned rice vinegar** 1tbsp
- **Honey** 1tbsp
- **Salt** 1tspn
- **Pepper** 1/2tsp
- **Cacciotta cheese** 1/4 cup grated
- **Radish microgreens**
- **Beetroot microgreens**

METHOD

1 Use a sharp knife to cut out the tough midrib of each kale leaf, and discard or compost. Slice the leaves crosswise into thin, 1/4 inch wide slices. The easiest way to do this is to work with a small bunch of leaves at a time, stack the leaves and roll them into a loose cigar shape. Then using a sharp knife, work from one end of the 'cigar' to the other, slicing 1/4 inch off from the end. Place the kale slices into a large bowl.

2 Cut the cherry tomatoes into quarters.

3 In a smaller bowl, whisk together the Kachampoli vinegar, olive oil, rice vinegar, honey, salt, and pepper. Five minutes before serving, toss the kale together with the cherry tomatoes, all the microgreens, and the dressing, allowing the kale to marinate a bit. Right before serving, stir in the grated Cacciotta.

FIDDLEHEAD FERNS

INGREDIENTS

- Fiddlehead fern 150gms
- Fresh palm hearts 100gms
- Garlic, 1 clove finely chopped
- Onion, 1 bulb finely chopped
- Salted butter 100gms
- Dry white wine 50ml
- Whey 200ml
- Salt to taste
- Black pepper, to taste

METHOD

1 Clean the ferns in running water. Trim the ends and pat dry with a kitchen towel.

2 Finely chop the palm heart. In a heavy bottom pan, melt part of the butter, then add garlic, onion and a pinch of salt. Sauté for a few minutes till they sweat — the mixture should not colour at all. Deglaze the pan with white wine, then add in the palm hearts and let them cook slowly. Add salt and pepper to taste.

3 Add the whey and let it cook for a couple minutes more. Then blend till smooth and pass through a sieve.

4 In a different pan, melt the remaining butter, sauté the fiddleheads and season to taste.

5 Plate with the palm heart puree below, topped with fiddleheads. ▶

POPCORN ICE CREAM

INGREDIENTS

- Popcorn 100gms
- Milk 100gms
- Cream 100gms
- Sugar 50gms

RHUBARB COMPOTE:

- Rhubarb 200gms
- Water 200gms
- Sugar 40gms
- Agar 4gms
- Cookies, 2 crushed

METHOD

1 Mix the milk, cream, sugar and popcorn together and let it come to a boil. Take it off the heat, chill, then blend the mixture.

2 Let the mixture freeze, then churn in an ice cream machine as per instructions.

3 Chop the rhubarb and add to water, sugar and agar. Boil the mixture, then blend.

4 Let the rhubarb mixture cool, and strain.

5 To plate, start with a sprinkle of crushed cookies, then top with a scoop of ice cream and the rhubarb jam.

AVOCADO SALAD

INGREDIENTS

- Avocado 1 whole
- Foxtail millet 75gms
- Sour cream 80gms
- Parsley, 40gms finely chopped
- Salt, to taste
- Black pepper, to taste
- Orange zest, grated
- Lemons 2
- Edible flowers 10

METHOD

- 1 Soak the millets overnight, then blanch till soft. Add sour cream, chopped parsley, orange zest and adjust seasoning.
- 2 Slice the avocado, then marinate with lemon, salt and pepper.
- 3 Put a scoop of the millet on a plate and cover with the sliced avocado. Garnish with edible flowers. GH

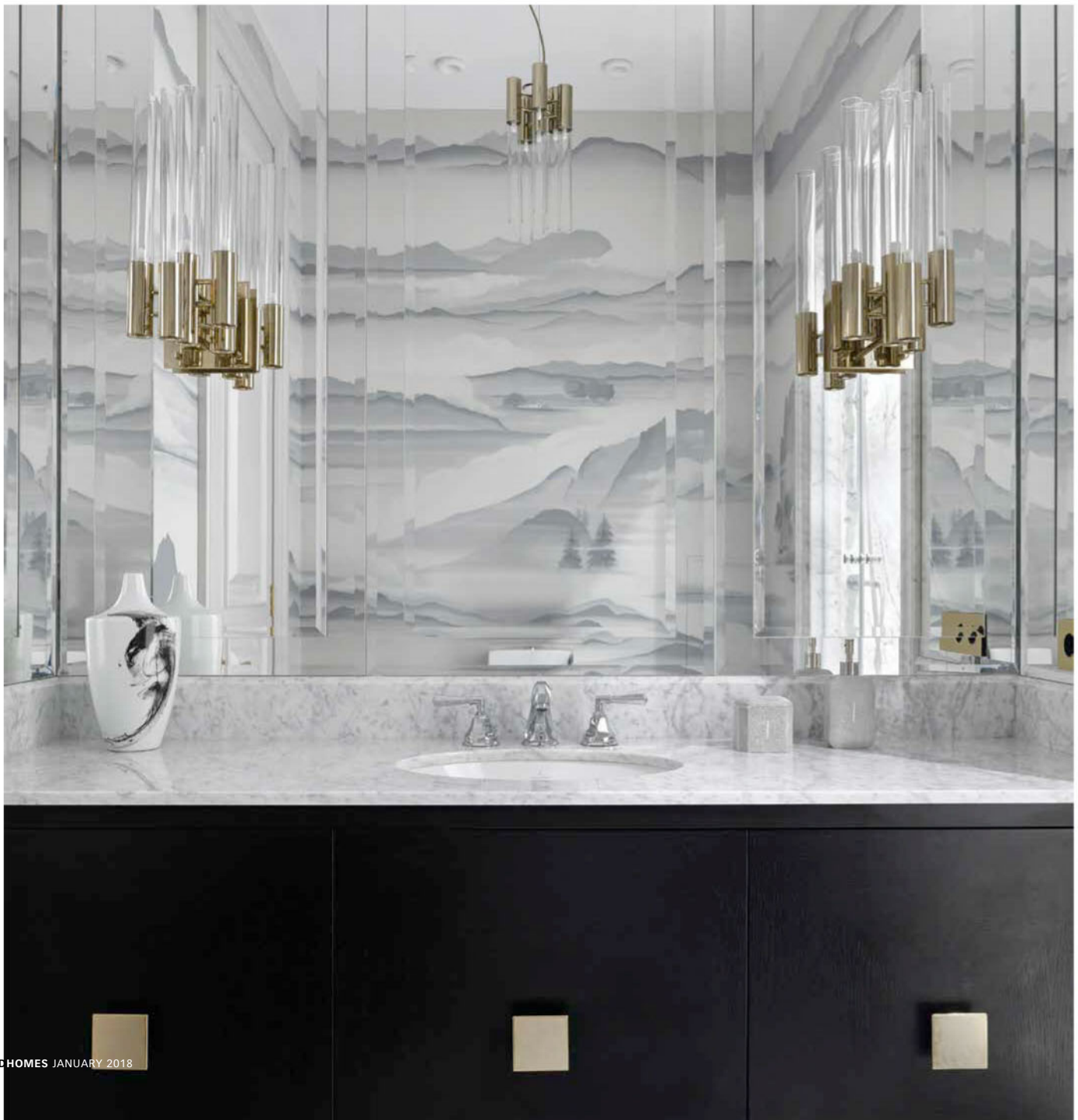

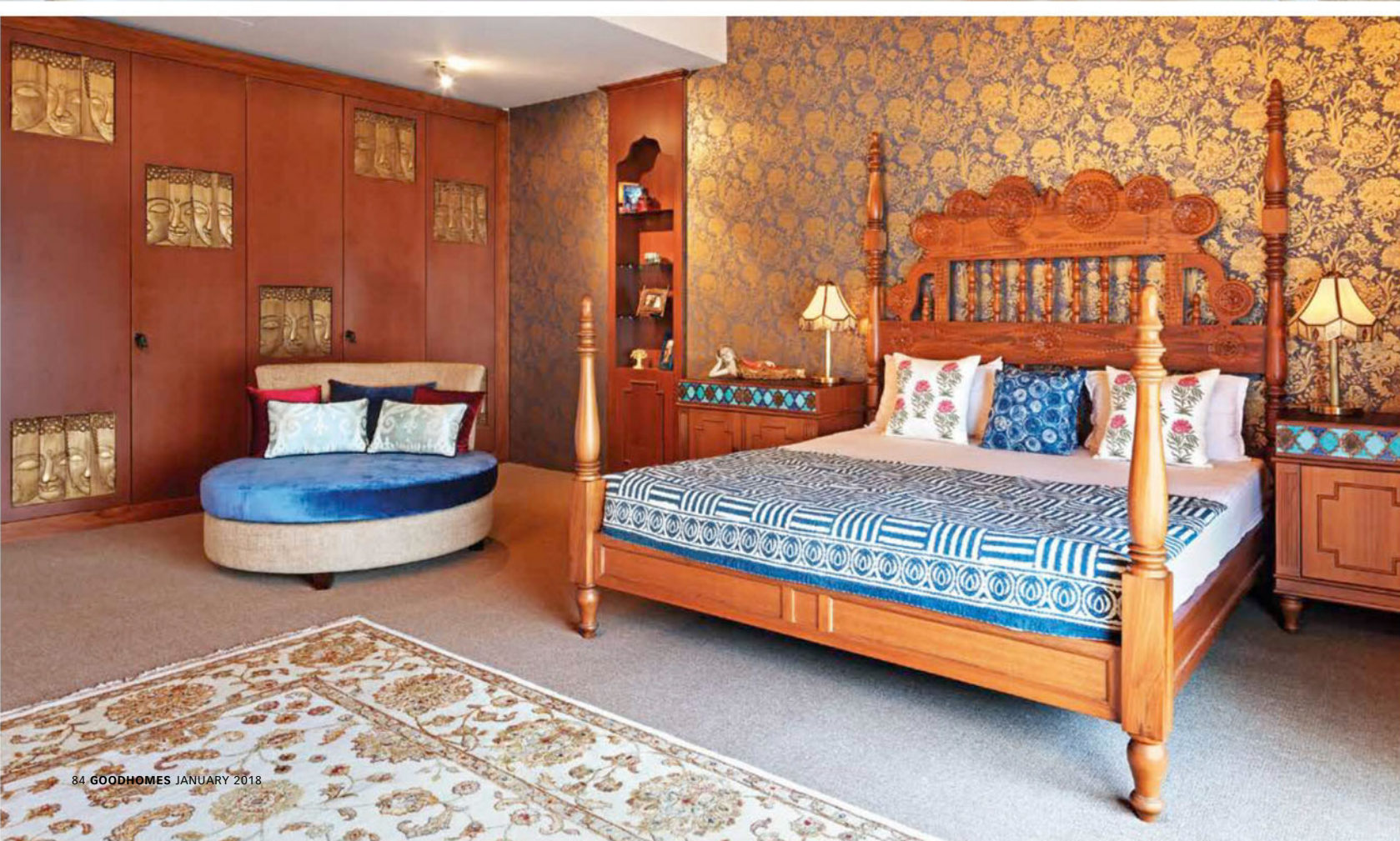

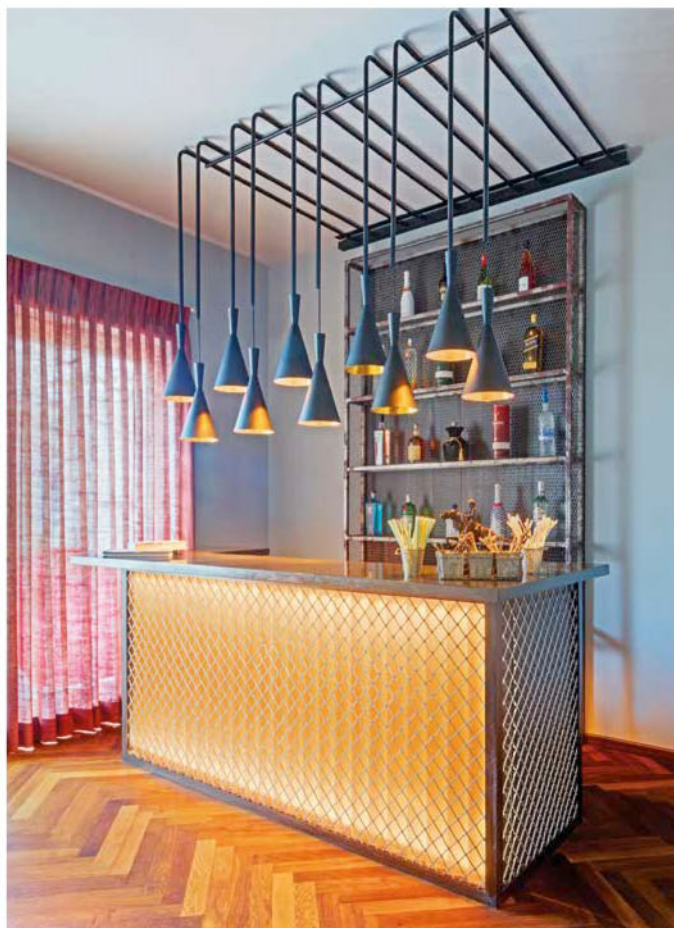

The designers subscribes to less is more, as a design philosophy. The clean lines effortlessly meld contemporary urban tones to create a narrative where form follows function.

A rare treat of various vistas that invite relaxation and calm, the owners of Cane Boutique, Ritu and Khushi Todi's home in Bengaluru is all about grandeur. A villa in a gated community, the exteriors follow an elegant Greek architectural style with columns and arches, while the interiors are all about open-plan living. “We broke a few walls to extend the space and followed an open plan. A fish pond inside the living room was planned to create a water element within the house for calm,” shares Ritu. Continuing the grandeur, the common spaces are designed with a touch of — textured walls, large Swarovski chandeliers, double-height linen drapes, mother-of-pearl doors, rich fabrics and fur carpets.

Luxury, comfort and practicality form the basis of the design philosophy both Ritu and Khushi give a big thumbs up to when it comes to designing a home. This comes through as soon as you walk into the living room, which is divided into three conversation areas, and features large artworks and furniture from Cane Boutique. 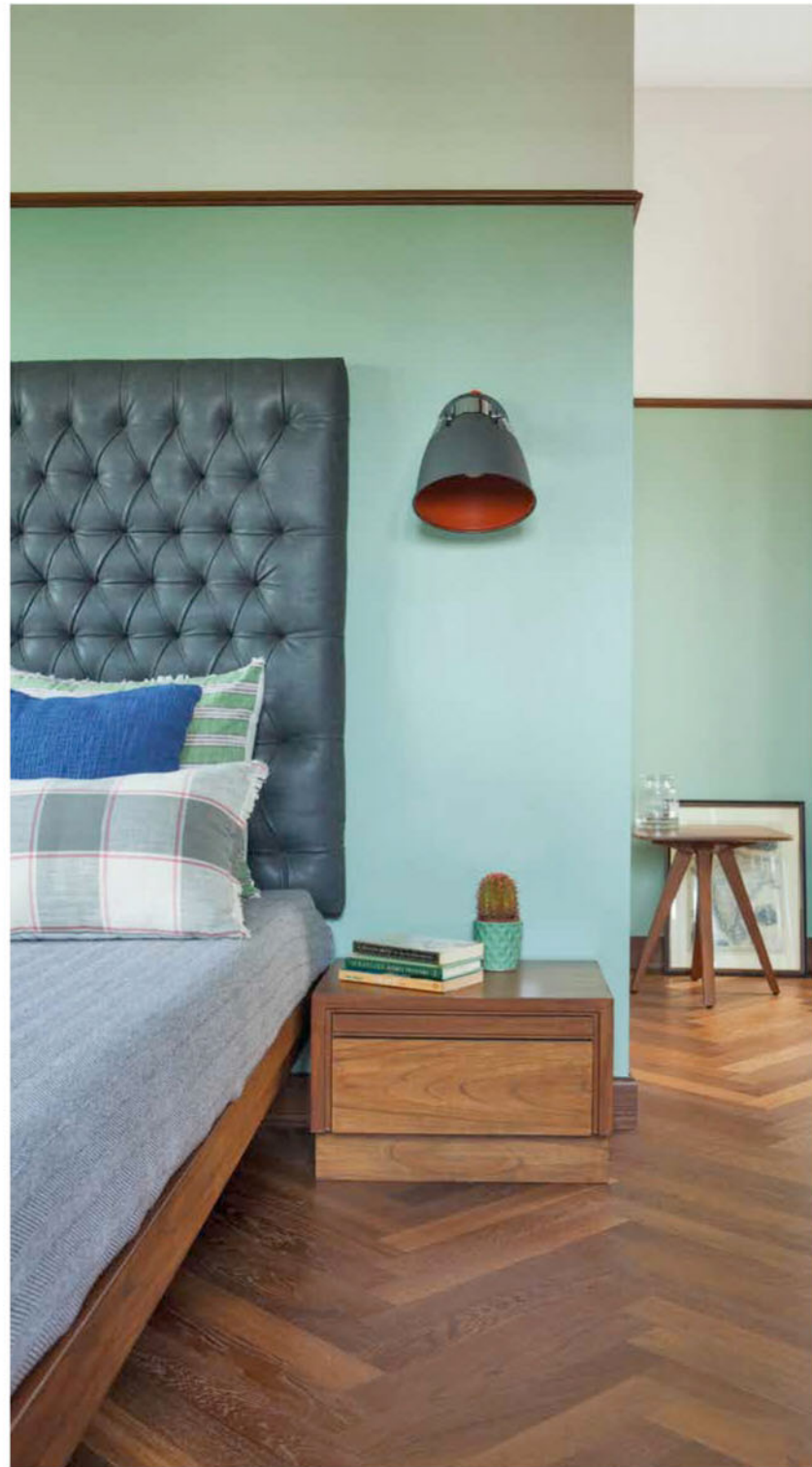

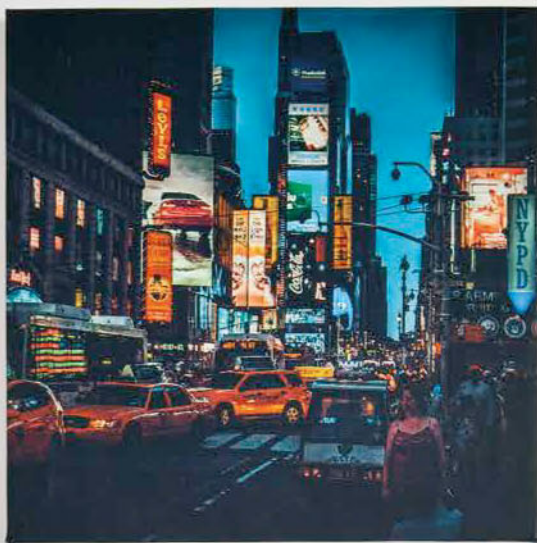

This sprawling Mumbai home draws inspiration from travel lores of Europe. Owner of one of the leading logistics supply chain companies, Rhea Vazirani brought in interior designer Richa Bahl to create a canvas where textures, materials and elements come together in perfect sync. There is nothing distracting — every element plays the hero with oodles of light filtering in through the bay windows. Flanked by the sea on one side and lush greenery on the other, Richa says, “I’ve created a space that goes beyond the trends that are in play, with blurred lines between the inside and the outside.”

As we slowly drink in the seamlessly flowing space — the welcoming, tucked-away, brick-walled dining area, the stylish living space, the book shelf and the sliding glass — we are met with a canvas that rests on the tenets of classicism. Not shying away from experimenting, she says, “I am still Old School when it comes to design. The simplicity of design in an old school canvas is timeless.” The challenge was when the acclaimed designer was called in midway into the project, when the space planning was already underway. With an everyday penalty looming like a dark cloud, the designer and her team worked around the clock to create a home for the owners that resonated a design vibe that could well be found in an European home. Building on Rhea’s design aesthetics, Richa says, “The home comes alive with the beauty of clean lines, the warmth of accessories, smart space division and a different play of salmon and green colours that come together to create an unparalleled story.” 

Celebrating minimalism, Richa says, “The space is a balance of wooden and concrete flooring. No busy patterns come into play. The thumb rule of creating a minimalistic place is striking a balance between bringing in and taking out elements. Rhea’s house is minimalistic, yet has an interesting play of many things.”
